

Maths: We will be using the Power Maths scheme of work to teach the children about number and place value for numbers to 100. The children will learn how to compare, order and place numbers on a line.



Writing: During the term the children will write a set of instructions about caring for an imaginary pet based on the text 'How To Wash A Woolly Mammoth' by Michelle Robinson and Kate Hindley, They will also write a narrative based on the story 'A Mouse called Julian' by Joe Todd-Stanton.



Read Write Inc - The children will continue to have daily RWi lessons in school. The children will take home an AR/colour banded book as well as RWi book bag book to support their reading from home.



Geography - why can't penguins fly

In this enquiry children learn about the continent of Antarctica and are able to locate it in relation to all the continents and oceans of the world and compare it to their local area. Through the study of hot and cold areas of the world pupils are able to understand why Antarctica is so cold and dry. The concept of a desert is developed through a comparative study of the Sahara Desert and pupils are able to consolidate their understanding of adaptation by comparing the life of Emperor Penguins with that of Camels.



RE - The Good News that Jesus Brings -

The children will be learning about friendship, peace and love and how these are taught through the christian faith.



PSHE - Learning that families are composed of different people who offer each other care and support. Learning how other people show their feelings and how to respond to them. Looking at conventions of manners and developing an understanding of self-respect.



PE - will be every Monday and Tuesday. Please can you ensure your child has a PE Kit in school.

Textiles - The children will design and make their own pouches using simple sewing skills.



Computing - The children will be learning about technology and how we use it in everyday life. They will be looking at devices, what they are used for and to use them safely.

Music - The children will be exploring pitch, pattern and notation and will have weekly singing assemblies with Mrs Mencarini.



Science: We will be Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other.



We will also be able to describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain, and identify and name different sources of food
